Brookside Site Update from Mr Ford

When you thought he was a traditional 'school caretaker' and realise what that ACTUALLY means

We are currently working on a number of projects all around the school site here at Brookside. A massive focus is now, and has been, trying to conserve and increase the amount of wildlife we have at the school. For the kids to understand, not only how big issues affect the world, the oceans etc, but also how to take care of our very own community too. We have had a number of donations from parents and family members which have allowed us to put up 3 new nest boxes (all of which are now full with resident birds) in all areas (EYFS, and both Key Stage areas) – we hope in the future to get a LIVE STREAM CAMERA inside them, which will link across to EYFS and Reception, so that the children can watch baby birds hatch and feed next spring.

We are also in the process of making and hiding a number of hedgehog boxes, for our spiky friends – using recycled materials. We meaning, myself, Miss Wise and a LARGE number of children who are members of KOBS.

With the help of our willing KOBS members, we have most recently started developing the Wildlife Area in the corner of the big sports field (where all the tree's are) and they have been working hard to clear the footpaths, which have lain un-used for the last 10 years. This was they know they can walk safely around the Wildlife Area without disturbing all the creatures we are trying to get to come and live with us! We have also been making some HUGE bug hotels, and Wyevale have donated a number of plants to brighten up the place – using recycled tyres and pots that have had had hanging around.

I am trying to teach the children the importance of using what we have, and with some effort, you can make wonderful things, which don't always have to be brand new!

FUTURE HOPES?

We have had 60 trees donated by the Woodland Trust – due to **be delivered in** November – we are going to try and organise a planting event for children and parents who would like to help us. GET YOUR WELLIES AND SPADES READY!

We are hoping to have more nest boxes and also bat boxes donated or made too (so if you have any hanging around your home, please feel free to bring those in at any time!) One big project we would like the children to help start is to create a wildlife map of Brookside, which would be a trail which aims to help children of all ages, to identify all the tree species, plants and animals which we have here. This tie in with the children's themes of conservation, looking after our planet and recycling too.

There are also another 2 Wildlife Areas being planned for Key Stage 1 and the EYFS children.
